

4 Subject Areas Affected (& Their Dewey Decimal Numbers)

- 974.721 - Long Island [regional histories, bi-county & 4-county]
- 974.724 - Queens County [histories prior to Nassau County's separation]
- 974.7245 - Nassau County [after separated from Queens, in 1899]
- 974.725 - Suffolk County [earlier, the East Riding of Yorkshire]

BASICS OF THE REVISED SHELF REORGANIZATION

CODE

TYPE OF HISTORIES

R-LI -

L.I. Regional Histories

- R-LI-2 = Nassau & Suffolk (bicounty studies) – Long Island *proper*
- R-LI-4 = adds Kings & Queens Counties – the entire island, including NYC boroughs

CO-

L.I. County Histories

- Followed either by SUFF[olk] or NASS[au]
- [Aside: Most Kings & Queens Borough Histories are located in PML's NY REF Collection]

I-

L.I. Outer Island Histories

- Histories of the smaller, "satellite" islands, surrounding most of Long Island
- E.g.: Gardiners [I-GRDNR], Fire [I-FIRE], Fishers [I-FISH], Robins [I-ROBN] Islands

T-

L.I. Town Histories & Records

- E.g.: Brookhaven Town [T-BROO], Islip Town [T-ISLP]
- **Note:** In NYS, Towns are large geographic & political segments of Counties

V-

L.I. Village Histories & Records

- Individual villages, whether incorporated or unincorporated; + 2 cities in Nassau
- E.g.: Amityville [V-AMITY]

VGP -

Customary L.I. Village Groupings & Their Histories

- Three Village area, Five Towns, The Islips, The Moriches, The Hamptons



Why We Bothered

For local history purposes, the ordinarily helpful, *Dewey Decimal Classification System* failed to identify anything smaller than a county. It made no distinction between two basic varieties of L.I. regional works – bi-county (i.e., Nassau-Suffolk), & 4-county (i.e., Suffolk-Nassau-Queens-Kings) – and we receive requests emphatically for only one version, and not the other. Worse, histories and records of individual towns, villages and L.I.’s outer islands were jumbled together, without distinction. Their traditional arrangement on the shelves was not geographic, but mainly by author, further compounding the scatter. Most of our books (in the 4 areas identified on the previous page) refer to a specific *geographic area or locale*. When the computer catalog was down...well you get the picture. As people often ask for everything we have on a particular town, village, island, cluster of villages / region of the County (customarily known by a single name), shelf scatter does not promote rapidly getting down to work, or efficient, effective use of the collection, whether the purpose is for historical or genealogical research, curriculum expansion, a student project (ranging anywhere from the elementary to graduate levels), a news report on deadline, a scholarly or general article, background for a novel, or following a line of one’s own interest or expanding one’s horizons.

The main problem area was confined to the 4 Dewey Decimal Numbers identified above. ***It became obvious that something original needed to be developed to improve speed of access to these materials. The solution was a way to regroup the books under a system of geographic codes; and within these, the use of a set of abbreviated place names that would fit on a spine label, and sound like the place they were.*** The result was the reorganization of the collection using ***the method below, & faster, more efficient, more effective library service, in local history.***

Ongoing Method & Purpose: Celia M. Hastings Local History Room staff continue to work with the PML Cataloging Department, to ensure consistent application of this organizational scheme, to occasionally add a new place name abbreviation, ***to generally promote improved access to geographically-oriented Local History material:*** (a) for patrons’ greater research convenience, freeing more of their time for study, (b) to permit ease of browsing and continuous service, even when the library catalog is down, and (c) when a librarian relatively unfamiliar with the collection is on duty.



Place Name Abbreviations (A Few Quick, Helpful Things to Know)

- **Every Suffolk & Nassau County place name** in use, is assigned an abbreviation
- Assignment of abbreviations is *somewhat arbitrary*, somewhat following old library codes
- Place name abbreviations are ***mnemonic*** (i.e., they “sound like” what they represent; e.g.: BABL = Babylon)
- Place names on the shelf, are ***fairly alphabetic***, variations being due to the (not strictly alphabetic) shorthand used for places, needed to fit them easily on a the spine label of a book. ***Look*** on the shelf ***under the initial letter*** of the place, ***and you should find the place name you seek fairly quickly.*** If not, a **complete list of place name abbreviations appears in the *Main Geographic Directory*** (below).
- **Place name abbreviations appear on a book’s spine label, below the Dewey Decimal Number, immediately after one of the Geographic Codes**, (listed above): *E.g.*, **T-BROO** means the **Town of Brookhaven**, while **V-BRKHV** means the **village of the same name**.
- **Defunct historic place names are generally avoided, in favor of current place names;** e.g., **Lindenhurst (V-LNDNH)**, the current name is used, instead of its pre-WWI name, **Breslau** (discarded well before WWI’s local anti-German riots); the Fourier utopian community name, **Modern Times**, is discarded in favor of the modern village name, **Brentwood (V-BRNTW)**.



The Main Geographic Directory

Of Parts of L.I. in N.Y.C.:

- Works on **Brooklyn** [NYC Borough / Kings County, NY] are generally found in PML's *NY REF Collection*, under **974.723**
- Works on **Queens County** [also up to 1899, containing 3 Eastern Towns that broke away to become Nassau County, NY, when the rest of Queens became part of Greater NYC] are often found in PML's *NY REF Collection*, under **974.724**; though selected works do appear under the same number in the *LI REF Collection* as well (often emphasizing what would later become Nassau County)
